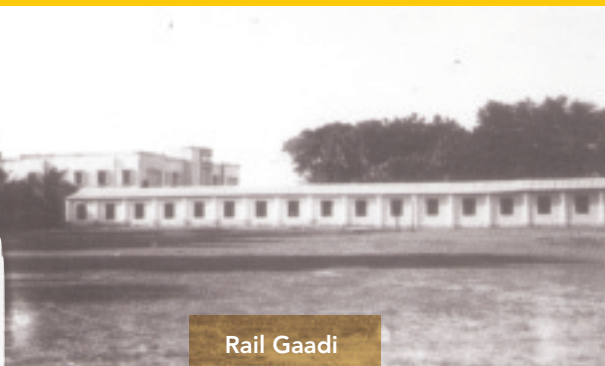
The Brothers came to India in 1875 and took charge of a large Anglo-Indian School. This seed has grown into

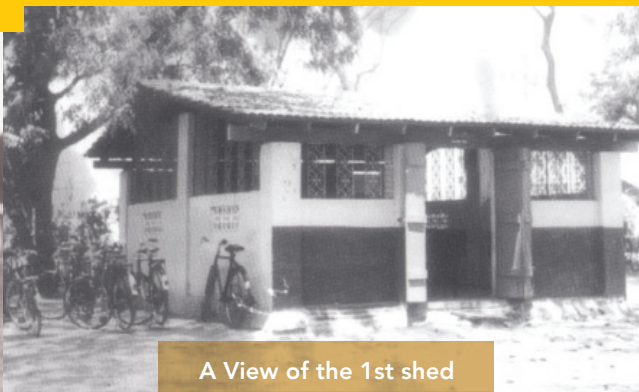




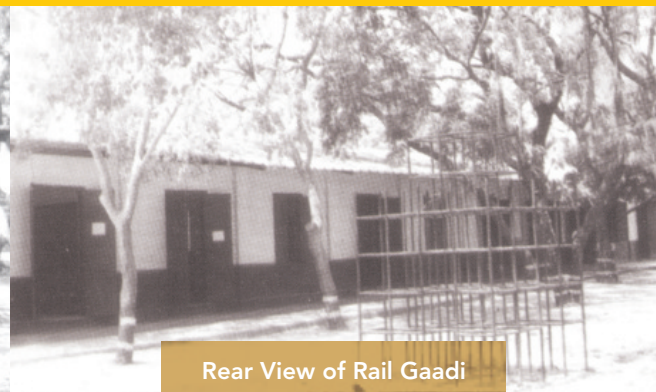

A View of the 1st shed

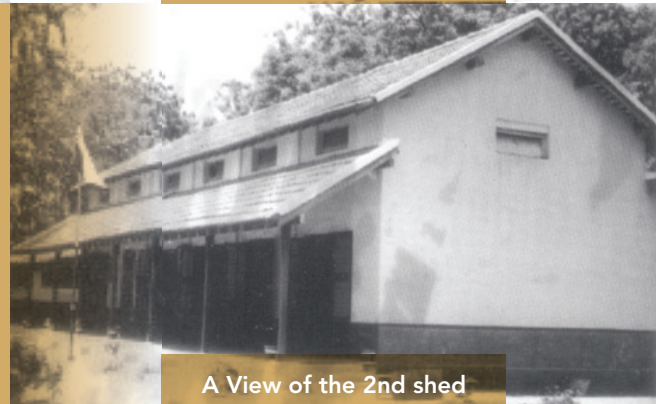


Rear View of Rail Gaadi

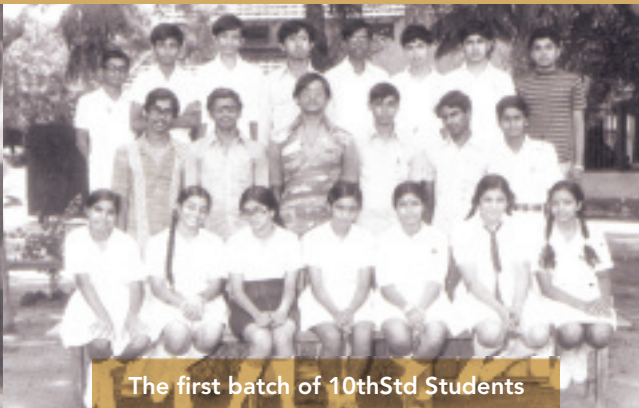

■ St. Michael's Academy Matriculation Higher Secondary school founded in the year 1953 stands in beautiful surroundings overlooking the Adyar River and is within a few minutes' walk from the Adyar bus stand. It is steered by the Patrician Brothers who have well known schools in India and abroad.

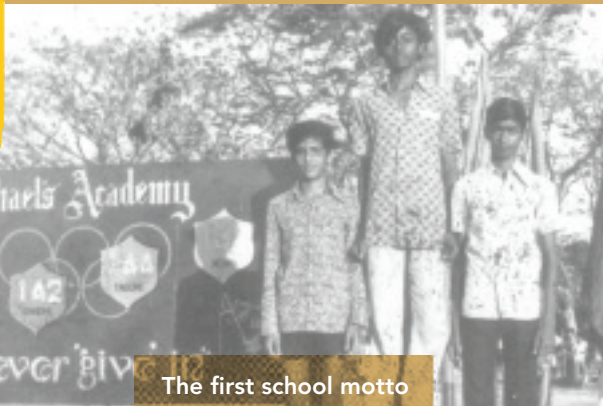

Admission :

■ [A] Admission Procedure

No pupil will be admitted without the Transfer Certificate from the last school attended. The Transfer Certificate should be countersigned by the Inspector of Schools in case of those coming from States other than Tamilnadu.

Students seeking admission into UKG to Std IX must take the entrance test. Selection will be made purely on merit.

Students seeking admission Std XI must take the entrance examination.

The Transfer Certificate will be issued only on a requisition made by the parent / guardian. It will be issued only when the fee has been paid in full.

Children should have completed 3 years as on June 30th in order to qualify for admission to LKG.

Admission cannot be claimed as a matter of right. Any attempt to use influence, unfair means or recommendation for admission, will lead to automatic disqualification. The school does not have any agents for admission.

The Academic Program

- In order to achieve the educational goals, the school is divided into five sections.

Kindergarten	:	LKG-UKG
Junior School	:	Std I-V
Middle School	:	Std VI-VIII
High School	:	Std IX –X
Higher Secondary School	:	Std XI- XII

Each section is headed by a co-ordinator who is responsible for its smooth functioning



Medium of instruction

- The medium of instruction and first language from LKG to XII classes is English.
- Tamil and Hindi are taught from grade I-V.
- Tamil , Hindi and French are taught from VI-XII .



{ Kindergarten

- Our aim is to provide a curriculum which is engaging exciting challenging and relevant to children. We help children analyze, synthesize and understand what they learn. A wide range of fun filled activities are planned on a regular basis to help children explore their creativity and uniqueness. Formation of good relationships, positive attitude, social behaviour and self discipline are inculcated among children for better understanding of different cultures and customs.



Primary (1-5)

- The goal of the primary curriculum is to lay a strong educational foundation. It is broadly based and takes into account the fact that each one enters the formal education with different level of readiness. The curriculum is planned to develop in the students a respect and love for learning , while giving them the strong basic skills , which they will need to continue their education.

We also believe that everyone should be valued, respected, nurtured and encouraged to fulfil their potential within a supportive, caring, inclusive environment. Therefore we provide a safe environment where pupils enjoy learning; create a learning community that enables creativity, good practice, success to embrace the wider community.



{ Middle & Secondary (6-10)

- The middle school (VI-VIII) is a smooth transition from Primary to High School. The syllabus for every subject of stds VI, VII, and VIII is framed by the teachers themselves, hence it is very flexible and needs of the child are incorporated in the syllabus. The students of IX and X are prepared for an all India Examination, ICSE, (Indian Certificate of Secondary Education) conducted by the Council for the Indian School Certificate. We offer the students of Stds. IX and X, the following subjects:

English Language and Literature, Hindi, History & Civics and Geography, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Mathematics, Economics, Art and Computer application to cater to the individual abilities and interests.

The project work supports and extends the innate curiosity of the child and develops the attitudes and skills necessary to gain an understanding of the world around.

Students learn in a caring environment where their ideas are freely expressed and valued. This creates a stimulating learning situation for all.

The education programme is constantly modified according to the needs of the students and the changing times. This programme not only equips the children to enter colleges but also prepare them with skills that they need, to flourish them for their future role as world citizens.





{ Higher Secondary

- At the Higher Secondary level , academics is more examination oriented. It prepares the students to face the Board Examinations and competitive Examinations with confidence. We follow the Tamilnadu Higher Secondary State Board and ISC pattern of education, with the examinations taken at the end of Std. XII.

{ Value Based Education

- We, at St. Michael's Academy believe that along with developing academically strong students, an important goal of education is to teach children to be socially responsible citizens who would learn from the youngest ages how to give their best for the greater cause. Regular Catechism for all Christian Students and Value Education classes for children of all other religions is incorporated in our curriculum.

Special Features in our Curriculum - towards improving quality in education

■ Career Guidance

The career guidance programs for std. X and XII , provide information on the various career opportunities. The students receive guidance from resource persons on important issues such as , aptitude to choose subjects at the higher secondary levels and consequent college education. An awareness in the changing scenario in National and Global trends , helps them to integrate their ideas , aspirations and values.



General Regulations

■ School Assembly

Students from Stds I – XII must attend the general assembly at 7.50 am. Students will assemble class wise and absolute silence must be maintained.

Assembly begins with important announcements for the day. This is followed by a common prayer, the Pledge and the School Song or the National Anthem.

After the Assembly, students will march briskly, silently and in order, to their respective classrooms. Silence must be observed throughout the school hours and also while moving from one classroom to another.

■ Discipline

A major breach of discipline, grave misconduct or other acts of indiscipline may render a student liable for expulsion. The Principal's decision is final in all disciplinary matters. The Character Certificate which is issued to students when leaving school, will depend entirely on their behaviour during the school career

■ Punctuality:

1. A late register will be maintained.
2. Parents will be held responsible if their wards are late to school more than twice in a month.
3. House-points will be deducted for latecomers.

General Regulations

■ Department:

Personal cleanliness as well as respectful behaviour towards the staff, visitors and fellow students is expected at all times. Hence, hands in pockets, slouching gait, untidiness, unclean uniforms etc., are considered unbecoming.

■ Conversation:

English is the medium of instruction, hence students are expected to speak English at all times.

Academic Progress: Frequent absence, lack of application to studies or failure to make satisfactory progress may lead to exclusion from the examinations and may make it necessary for the school authorities to demand the student's withdrawal.

■ Tuitions:

Students are not permitted to engage any of the school teachers for private tuition without the written sanction of the Principal.



■ Attendance:

A student absent from class due to illness or unforeseen circumstances must bring a letter from his/her parents explaining the reason for the absence.

Prior sanction must be obtained for absence due to any other reason.

The Principal can refuse leave of absence to any student without assigning any reason.

If, for some justifiable reason a student is not present on the reopening day, the Principal should be informed about it in advance, failing which his/her name will be removed from the school register. The vacant seat will then be offered to one of the many deserving applicants.

Students absent from any examination will be considered as having failed, unless it is established that their absence was due to illness.

■ **School Property:**

Students are forbidden to write scribble or splash ink on the school or compound walls. Damage to school property will be severely dealt with. Besides, the cost of repairs or replacement must be borne by the parents.

■ **Valuables :**

The School is not responsible for goods lost. It is not advisable to bring valuable articles like expensive watches, fountain pens, gold ornaments etc., to school.

■ **Mobile Phones :**

Students are strictly warned against carrying mobile phones into the school campus. Any violation of this rule, will result in the authorities confiscating the same.

■ **Two Wheelers:**

Students are not permitted to come into the campus on two wheelers.

■ **Security:**

Students are not allowed to leave the school premises without permission from the Principal.

- a) Students who come to school in the care of servants, are not to leave before the servants arrive. In case of any delay, they should report to the school office.
- b) Students must not loiter around but return home without delay. Students are cautioned against buying anything, especially eatables, from street vendors.



- c) Maximum precaution will be taken for the safety of every child. However, the School authorities will not be held responsible for any unavoidable accidents.
- d) Parents must be strict about their daughters returning home from school immediately after games. Any problem in this connection, must be reported to the Principal immediately.
- e) Fire works will not be allowed inside the campus, in connection with any festival or celebration.
- f) Students are permitted to stay back after school hours, only if they are involved in sports and games, extra curricular activities or remedial classes.
- g) No nail polish, long nails, dirty nails, mehendi and tattoos are allowed

Any dispute is subject to the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts in Chennai city only.



Promotions

1. Promotion to the next class depends on the whole year's work, on regular attendance, on the overall development and the ability to cope with the next step in the student's education.
2. Evaluation of the academic performance will be based on the tests and examinations conducted and the assignments and projects allotted from time to time.
3. A student must obtain 40% in all the subjects in order to be eligible for promotion to the next class.
4. Consideration will be shown for co-curricular and extra-curricular achievements.
5. Only those students with a minimum of 85% attendance of the working days during each academic year will be considered for promotion.

6. No special arrangements will be made for pupils, who for any reason, are absent from the examination and there is no provision for retest.
7. The decision of the school authorities will be final with regard to promotion.
8. The school will not retain the answer scripts of the students beyond thirty days from the date of the examinations.
9. The school will not be responsible for parents' failure to see the progress report of their wards. Report Cards are to be collected only by parents / guardians on the Open Days.

Transfer Certificate

- A requisition for the Transfer Certificate must be made before March 31st. The Transfer Certificate will be issued only on a requisition made by both the Parents / Guardian. It will be issued only when the fee has been paid in full.



Co-operation of Parents

Prime importance is attached to building a sound character in students.

The co-operation of all parents is expected in ensuring the students regular and punctual attendance, good general behaviour and execution of home-work.

Parents should inspect the students' school diary regularly.

Parents / Guardians must sign the Progress Report of their wards.

Change of address of parent or guardian must be intimated to the school office in writing and without delay, failing which, the school will not be responsible for non-receipt of communication addressed to the parent / guardian.



Parents are welcome to visit the school. However, they are requested not to enter the classrooms during school hours without first consulting the Principal. Complaints, if any, should be made only to the Principal and not the teacher.

Students will not be permitted to drive two wheelers or four wheelers to and from school.

Parents are requested to abide by the Traffic Rules laid down by the school.

Parents are expected to be active members of the P.T.A. and are welcome to offer their assistance in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities.

Govt. Disciplinary Regulations

■ (Tamilnadu Education Rules (1973) (Nos. 93-98)

The following rules shall be applied to Higher Secondary Schools:

1. No Student who has been convicted of any offence in a criminal court will be allowed to continue his studies in the school.
2. Students should abstain from active participation in party or communal politics.

Regulations

3. Students who indulge in political propaganda or who organise fellow-students into political factions in the premises of the school or who otherwise engage themselves in party politics are liable to be expelled from the school.
4. Students should not indulge in any activity leading to the disruption of peace and discipline and dislocation of normal work in the school. Students found guilty of violation of this rule, will be severely dealt with.
5. Ragging is strictly forbidden. Anyone who indulges in ragging will be severely dealt with.
6. Students who are guilty of:
 - a) Rude language towards the staff of the school (or)
 - b) Assault or attempt to assault the staff or fellow students of the school are liable to be expelled from the institution.
7. If a teacher by speech or otherwise seeks to mislead his/ her students into activities deemed objectionable, he / she is liable to be punished for dereliction of duty.
8. The Headmaster or other constituted school authorities may frame and issue from time to time disciplinary rules of a permanent or temporary character regulating the conduct outside the school, that seem necessary to maintain the credit, usefulness and reputation of the school.





Academics

Within the broad framework of the school curriculum, a multi-dimensional approach makes the learning process effective and enjoyable.

The Kindergarten level is child-centered and activity based. The cognitive process are made more meaningful by encouraging children to “hear, see and do” through the play-way method. This makes learning an enjoyable experience and provides a strong foundation for further development. Progress is evaluated through a continuous assessment programme.

The Primary School students are gradually introduced to a more formal pattern of learning. A flexible syllabus provides scope for originality and creativity, while emphasis is laid on understanding of the subject matter. Progress is determined by the students' performance in the Unit Tests and Terminal Examinations.

The students of the Middle School are trained to follow the syllabus prescribed by the Matriculation Board of Education. The mid-term tests help them to cope with the increasing volume of portions. Progress is determined by the students' performance in all the three Terminal Examinations.

At the High School and Higher Secondary level, academics is more examination-oriented. This prepares the students to face the Board examinations and competitive examinations with confidence.



Incentives:

Students who excel in sports, games, quiz debate, cultural and other curricular, extra-curricular and co-curricular activities are given prizes, trophies, awards and certificates.

Star Certificates are awarded to students who secure above 70% in each subject in the term examination.

(Classes I and above)

70% - 79% - Bronze Star Certificate

80% - 89% - Silver Star Certificate

90% - and above – Gold Star Certificate

Disincentives: To ensure proper discipline in school the following card system is enforced.

Pink Card : To be issued to the student defaulter for the following:

- Repeated careless and irregular work
- Irregular attendance
- Coming to school, out of uniform
- Coming late to school
- Disrupting classroom teaching
- Loitering out of the class without purpose
- Missing classes, Assembly, S.U.P.W, Library, P.T, etc. periods
- Not bringing the School Diary

Yellow Card : To be issued to the student defaulter concerned in the presence of the Co-ordinator and the parents for the following:

- Being disobedient
- Using abusive language
- Rude or insolent behaviour with a teacher
- Misbehaving in the bus
- Bullying fellow students and juniors and causing physical injuries and hurt
- Using unfair means during any examination
- Damaging school property (a fine also will be imposed)
- Yellow card will mean suspension from the school for a week

Red Card : To be issued to the student defaulter in the presence of the Principal and parents for the following:

- Misbehaving with a teacher
- Negative influence
- Bringing or using narcotic substance or alcohol
- 3 Pink Cards will be equivalent to the Red Card
- 2 Yellow Cards will be equivalent to one Red Card
- Red Card will mean suspension from the school for three weeks and expulsion from the school at the end of the academic year.

Fee Regulations:

- The Academic Year is divided into three terms:

- 1st Term - June to September
- 2nd Term - October to December
- 3rd Term - January to April

The school fees are normally collected in 3 instalments:

- 1st Term - Fees must be paid on or before the 1st week of June.
- 2nd Term - Fees must be paid on or before 1st week of October.
- 3rd Term - Fees must be paid on or before the 1st week of January.

A student joining or leaving the school in the middle of the academic year will have to pay fees for the whole year.
